



Olexi Pasyuk leads environmental policy section of the National Ecological Centre of Ukraine handling energy, transport and climate change. Since 2000 Olexi works for CEE Bankwatch Network – association of the environmental groups in Central and Eastern Europe monitoring activities of International Financial Institutions. Over this period his focused has moved from the closure of nuclear reactors in New EU Member countries to oil and gas development in Caucasus and Central Asia and recently to the countries of European Union neighbourhood.

Olexi has started his career in Greenpeace Ukraine where he was responsible for the energy campaign. His experience in the field was widened as he worked for Dutch Agency for Energy and Environment (Novem) and consulted Oil and Gas to Europe (INOGATE) Tacis programme. Olexi holds Master of Environmental Management from the University of Amsterdam and Specialist in Analytical Chemistry from Kyiv Taras Shevchenko University. He was teaching Environmental Impact Assessment course to the master students of 'Kyiv-Mohyla Academy' University.



Anna Shumeiko is a coordinator of energy efficiency projects at the National Ecological Centre of Ukraine. She is working on the issues of sustainable energy efficiency financing for the residential sector, transposition of corresponding EU legislation in Ukraine and related informational campaigns.
